

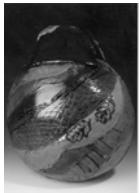

Gallery Artists send word...

Judy Rossman, artist to the stars, was thrilled to learn rocker Eric Clapton purchased one of her clay vessels at *L'Attitude Gallery and Sculpture Garden* at 218 Newbury Street, Boston during his recent stint at the *Comcast Center* in Mansfield, MA. Rossman was also commissioned by *L'Attitude* to execute a seven foot clay mural at *Children's Hospital* on Longwood Avenue in Boston. Installation will take place in summer 2008. Judy will

be teaching two drawing courses and a color theory workshop at SSAC this fall. **Susan A. Hollis**, part time Maine resident, is exhibiting work in a number of exhibits including Pastel Painter's of Maine 9th International Juried Exhibition in Bath, ME from July 10-August 10, 2008, Pastel Painters Society of Cape Cod 13th Annual *For Pastels Only*, August 1-31, 2008 and The Catherine Lorillard Wolfe Art Club 11th Annual Juried National from Sept 23-October 15, 2008 at the National Arts Club in New York. **Dianne Dolan** has an artist's book included in the show *Shelter: Unique Visions of a Universal Subject through Artist's Books*. Following the opening at Lasell College, the show will travel on to Pyramid Atlantic Art Center, MD; Fleet Library at RISD; 301 Gallery at Montserrat College, in Beverly, MA; and Wells College, Aurora, N.Y. Painter **Betty Rogers** won second place in watercolor at the Kingston Arts Festival and an Honorable Mention for Watercolor at the Pembroke Arts Festival. **Sally McCarthy** is having a two-person show at The Little Gallery at Sage College in Albany, NY from August 1- August 17, 2008. **Nancy Colella** was accepted into the 18th annual *Art in the Round Barn* show sponsored by the Green Mountain Cultural Center in Waitsfield, VT. Nancy will have five new works in the exhibition which opens September 21 and runs until October 13. Nancy will be joining the faculty at the SSAC this fall. **Kay Kopper** will be participating in an artist residency next May for four weeks at the Vermont Studio Center in Johnson, Vermont. The Studio Center is the largest Artist and Writer Residency Program in the United States. **Becky Haletky** won Best in Show at the 2008 Pembroke Arts Festival, and The Fawcett Memorial Award for Humor at the North River Arts Festival. She and **Mary Callahan** are co-chairing the New England Watercolor Society's North American Open Juried Show, at South Shore Art Center in September. Becky will be teaching a workshop at the Worcester Art Museum on October 4 & 5 entitled *Paint Worcester, the Architectural Landscape*. Her May workshop in Venice was a success, and her next overseas workshop will be to Counties Mayo and Donegal, Ireland from August 10-20, 2009. **Mary Wilkas** received Second Prize in mixed-media for "But in my spirit will I dwell and dream my dream and hold it true." at the Arts Affair, Marina Bay. **Sharon McCann Daly** won first place for pastels for her pastel titled "Shadow Dunes" and third place for pastels for her pastel titled "The Chilmark Wall" at the *All Island Art Show* in Martha's Vineyard on August 4, 2008. She also won the Mary Stevens award for *Shadow Dunes*.

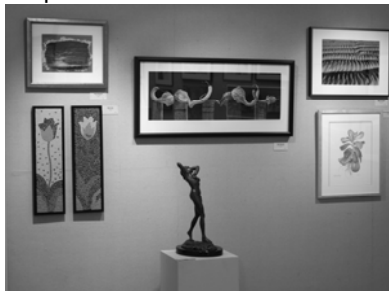

August 10, 2008 at the Landing Gallery in Rockland, Maine. One of her paintings was accepted into *OUT OF THE BLUE*, a national juried exhibition at the Attleboro Arts Museum, held in July. She is also participating in *ART FAIR*, held at the University Place Gallery of the Cambridge Art Association through August.

Margaret McWethy is opening an exhibit of recent paintings at the Egeli Gallery, Provincetown in August. Sculptor **Susan Luery** just completed a seven and a half foot tall monument honoring George

Washington. The sculpture will be installed in Cumberland, Maryland, the site of Fort Cumberland, an important outpost during the French and Indian War. Luery writes "This monument features GW as a 21 year

old Lt. Colonial in the Virginia Militia. To arrive at the image, I studied Washington's life; including books and letters. I was fortunate enough to speak to several noted historians and hear their thoughts on his personality. After visiting Mt. Vernon and reviewing their new exhibition featuring forensic studies of Washington's 'face' throughout his life as developed by scientists, I hired a live model whose bone structure comported with their view. I was also allowed to study the Houdon bust of Washington, considered the most accurate representation of his face. That sculpture is housed at the Boston Athenaeum, a private library. After bronzing in Maryland the sculpture will be installed at the site and unveiled in the fall."
